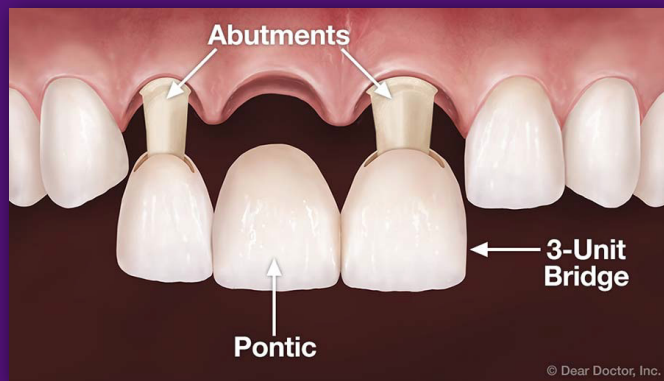


What is a Fixed Bridge?

A fixed bridge is a permanent restoration that replaces 1 or more missing teeth by anchoring artificial teeth to the natural teeth or implants next to the gap.

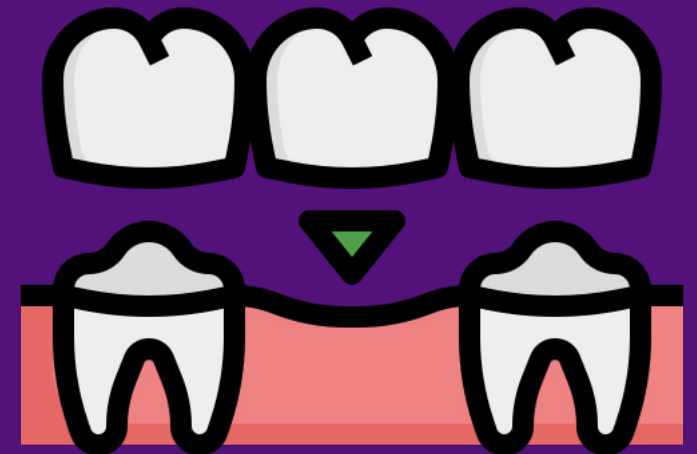

Your Guide to Fixed Bridge Restorations



How Long Does This Take?

Getting a bridge is usually a 2-3 visit process:



Prep and Temp Day

Your tooth is shaped and prepared to receive a bridge then a temporary bridge is placed to protect the anchor teeth while the lab fabricates the permanent bridge.



Take It Easy!

While in a temporary bridge for 2-3 weeks, avoid eating anything hard and sticky.



Try-In Day

The restoration is fitted and adjusted to fit the prepared abutments precisely. This may also be seat day.



Seat Day

The permanent bridge is fitted and cemented onto your tooth.

Designed To Last With Proper Care



Brush, floss, and use a fluoride rinse twice daily



Avoid chewing on hard objects like ice, hard candy, and pens



Wear a **custom-fitted occlusal nightguard** to protect the bridge and the rest of your teeth from grinding and clenching



Keep up with regular dental visits and call right away if your bridge feels loose, uncomfortable, or chipped.

Why Do I Need A Bridge?

Bridges help restore your smile if you have:

- 01 1 or more missing teeth
- 02 This will help you chew and smile more easily
- 03 Tooth replacement with a bridge keeps nearby teeth from shifting out of place
- 04 This will also help maintain your natural face shape and prevent jaw bone loss.
- 05 A bridge will help even out your bite to protect remaining teeth.
