

What is a Crown Restoration?

A crown restoration is a protective cover that fits over your tooth, like a strong cap (or "helmet") that protects and strengthens a damaged tooth; helping it look, feel, and be used naturally again.

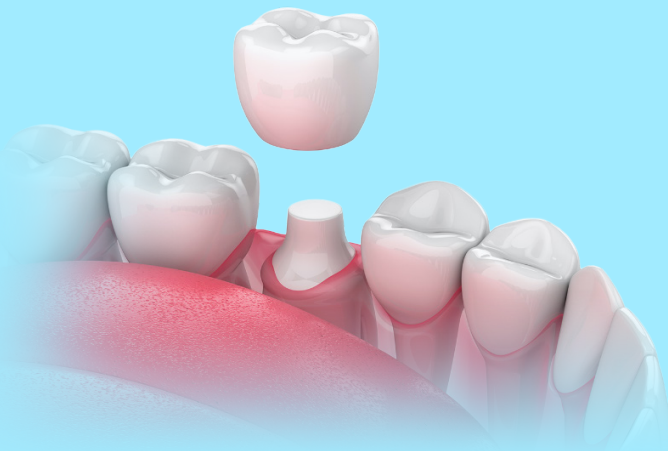

How Long Does This Take?

Getting a crown is usually a two-visit process:



Prep and Temp Day

Your tooth is shaped and prepared to receive a crown-then a temporary crown is placed to protect the tooth while the lab fabricates the permanent crown.



Take It Easy

While in a temporary crown for a week or two, avoid eating anything hard and sticky.



Seat Day

The permanent crown is fitted and cemented onto your tooth.

Designed To Last With Proper Care



Brush, floss, and use a fluoride rinse twice daily



Wear an occlusal nightguard to protect the crown and the rest of your teeth from grinding and clenching



Avoid chewing on hard objects like ice, hard candy, and pens



Keep up with regular dental visits and call right away if your crown feels loose, uncomfortable, or chipped.

Why Do I Need A Crown?

Crowns help protect and restore your tooth if you have:

- 01 A tooth with a large cavity or large old filling
- 02 A tooth that is cracked, worn down, or weak
- 03 A tooth that has had root canal treatment
- 04 A dental implant placed
- 05 A tooth that you'd like to improve, size, shape, or color
